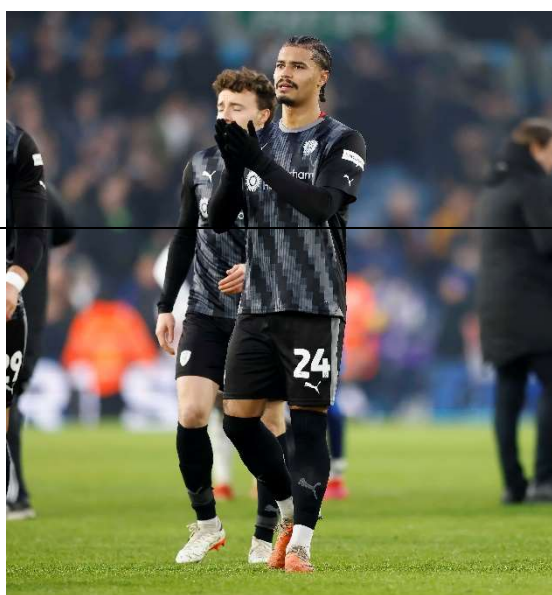

On the recovery process...

“Especially at the start of the recovery process, it is difficult, you’re just bed-bound and can’t really do a lot.

“After that you’ve just go to stay strong and just know that there is light at the end of the tunnel, staying positive was really important.

“I was on crutches for eight weeks, getting weight back on my legs was difficult, even when I was running with the physios or watching training, I was just itching to get back, but I got there in the end and now I’m just looking to kick on.

“I want to get back into the swing of things as soon as possible, because I want to help the team. We’re obviously in a difficult position right now but there is still plenty of football to be played and we have to believe that we’re good enough to get out of it.

“I feel like I’m ready to play a part and I’ll obviously do whatever the manager asks of me, again, I’m just delighted to be back.”
